Looking forward to seeing everyone here for the music, games, art, storytelling, drama, cooking and science.



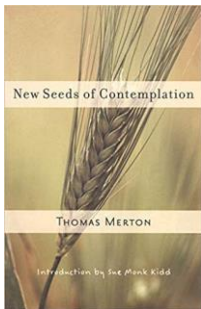
Community Coffee Time at Trinity
